For the second year running the program had a Performance and Development group of athletes which worked together and separately in activities throughout the 4 sessions held at Traralgon, Warragul and Sale . Major competitions of the year – Victorian Country Championships, Gippsland Championships, Victorian State Championships culminating in Australian Championships in April - were outstanding both with results and volume of medals. The Doc Shop 'Dare to Develop a Diamond' Netball Program Report 2022/2023

It has been an absolute pleasure to have been involved with the Dare to Develop a Diamond Program since its reintroduction to the Gippsland Sports Academy 7 years ago. The reward of seeing an athlete's continued growth, not only on the court but off the court, as they travel through like achieving their goals, knowing I have played a small role in that is the ultimate coach reward.

Our coach team worked very well as a unit, it is extremely pleasing to see them all taking steps forward in their coaching, Joanne Ballinger being appointed the inaugural coach of the newly formed Victorian Netball League club, Gippsland Stars as well as Carol Gregorovich who was appointed assistant coach for the Netball Victoria Talent Academy. Former Australian Diamond player and England Roses coach Sue Hawkins was an invaluable asset and made all the difference not only to the athletes but to the coaches, Sue was our point of difference.

We had 17 athletes identified to trial for Talent Academy. In addition, 2021 athlete Grace Van Tilburg was invited to trial for the 17 & Under State Team, meaning she is in the top 50 netball players in the State for her age group.

In 2022 we included competition as part of the program, the athletes were very excited at the prospect of measuring their skills against teams they wouldn't normally compete against, this proved to be extremely successful, allowed coaches the opportunity to plan skill development sessions focusing on areas of improvements and polishing already well-developed skills.

We had exceptional results, finishing first in the State at the Victorian inaugural inter-academy tournament was an absolute fairytale way for me to end my role as head. Congratulations to Lara Noblett who capped off an extraordinary year taking the Darrell White Award and Jo Ballinger who was recognised for her hard work receiving the Phil Shelley award, once again netball had an athlete and a coach on the overall winner list at the Academy awards.

VRAS Para-Sport Project

Program Report 2022/23

Gippsland Sports Academy (GSA) and Paralympics Australia (PA) are collaborating with the Victorian Regional Academies of Sport (VRAS) to identify and support talented para-athletes across Regional Victoria, which has been made possible by the support of Sport & Recreation Victoria and the Together More Active funding program.

The VRAS Para-Sport program is currently supporting 25 athletes across the state, of which ten have progressed to categorisation and support from the Victorian Institute of Sport, since joining the program highlighting its impact on athlete progression along the performance pathway. In 2023, we've even seen some of our supported athletes win Gold at World Championship level! We have recognised the importance of providing targeted support to athletes before they enter the high performance pathway, to ensure they are progressing and equipped to capitalise on any high performance support and servicing when it does become available to them.

There are currently five para-athletes with Individual Memberships to the Academy; the project focuses on removing barriers for these athletes in regional areas by offering to access strength & conditioning support and education, whilst also receiving additional targeted support from Paralympics Australia and their National Sports Organisation as required. The program aims to complement and elevate an athlete's current training program by building connection, and an understanding of the broader Paralympic Movement.

The 2023 instalment of the program began with an Induction Day at The Hangar (Essendon Football Club). Athletes took part in a number of sessions with VIS, Paralympics Australia and Regional Academy staff to explore Performance Lifestyle support, the importance of aligning members of your performance team such as physio and strength & conditioning, and other sessions with Australian Paralympian Mitch Gourley.

The program will continue in 2023-24, where we will be looking to identify new talent across Regional Victoria.

SCOPE


